Some airfare thoughts

To London Royal Brunei Airlines (BI) has an economy class fare for \$1395 including tax while business class will cost you \$3720 including tax. This fare is for departure up to 30 November after which fares increase substantially. BI travels via the city of Bandar Seri Begawan on the island of Borneo and currently has some of the cheapest fares to London.

There are a few companion business class fares with reduced prices if two or more of you travel together. Thai (TG), Japan Airlines (JL) and Air France (AF) have such fares.

Premium Economy class

A number of airlines now have PE seats on many of their aircraft. Fares are much less than business class and sometimes not much more than economy class.

Seats are wider than normal economy seats with more distance between you and the seat in front. Meals and service are also a cut above economy. However seats and service vary depending on the airline

Airport lounges

Many of you might believe that airport lounges are only for members, frequent flyers and those travelling business and first class. However there are a number of airports which have lounges for the general public. You can pre-book through me or pay upon arrival if there is enough room.

In May I had 7 hours between flights in Hong Kong so rather than spend time and money using a hotel I paid about \$70 and spent the time in the lounge. Before I boarded the flight I even had a shower, so it's not true what they say about Scotsman!

Airports with public loungers include Singapore, KL, Bangkok, Tokyo and Dubai. They are on the airside so no need to clear immigration. About \$30 for three hours is not a bad price to pay (Singapore Changi airport).

City Passes

There are a number of cities around the world which have pre-paid Tourist Passes which give you free access to many of the main attractions. This saves standing in queues. London has a Travelcard which allows for up to 7 days unlimited travel on train and buses. So buy before you go by letting me know which cities you are visiting.
